A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR OF THE TOWN COUNCIL

Saxmundham Spring 2022 Newsletter



This year, 2022, sees the 750th anniversary of the King's grant of our town's first Market Charter in 1272. Saxmundham proudly boasts being an historic market town, while also facing the future with confidence. A Town Guide published back in 1940 called Sax "a strange but fascinating mixture of the ancient and the modern." That still rings true!

We're living through difficult times again – which makes it all the more important to take time out to celebrate and promote our town, our history,

businesses and community. After all, it's not every day that you're 750 years old!

The Market Charter was granted by King Henry III, whose 56 year reign was the longest ever at that

time. We will, of course, also be marking the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II (a 70 year reign thus far!), with a Saxmundham Community Lunch on Sunday 4th June in the Market Place. The '750' celebrations will kick off on Saturday April 23rd, with a heritage & history event at the Market Hall in partnership with the Museum and Local History Society, with a little liquid refreshment to inspire our memories...

On the weekend of 8 – 10th July, we are organising a Festival with a 'Middle Ages' theme, complete with knights, colourful tents and activities, a Charter signing ceremony, plus a Vintage Market in the High Street and Fromus Square.

The Memorial Field, created in the aftermath of World War 1, sees its own 100th anniversary this year; we have a planned programme of improvements, and will hold a remembrance event there in November. The final main event of our year will be in December, when our Christmas Fair will again have a Victorian theme.

We hope you'll join with us in making our 750th anniversary a year to remember for Saxmundham.

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EXCITEMENT AT SAXMUNDHAM MARKET

Thanks to grant from East Suffolk and a donation from the Saxmundham Business Association the Town Council has appointed Jess Palmer and Michael Light as Town Centre Coordinators for 6 hours a week.

For our new coordinators, the top priority is to revive Saxmundham's Market which is currently a very small affair. There could be no better time to tackle this than in the 750th year of Saxmundham's Market Charter.

This year the Town Council is piloting 8 new artisan markets to be held on the 2nd Saturday of each month April-November. From April we will also be working to reinvigorate the Wednesday Market with new stalls and a fresh new look.

If the town is to retain its long-held status as a market town, we need to better support our loyal traders, entice new ones in, and increase footfall to ensure we can keep this vital resource in our town.

Saxmundham's Town website has had a redesign and we need your ongoing help to keep the information up to date. If you have a business or community group in Saxmundham you can have a free listing advertising your activities. Check the website to view whether you have been listed already and contact the Council with your

SPEED WATCH FOR SAXMUNDHAM



In common with many villages and towns across Suffolk, Saxmundham Town Council is seeking to encourage a volunteer-led Speedwatch team to work with our local Police in

reinforcing the 30 mph speed limit in areas of our town.

It is common knowledge that excess speed for the conditions, or the speed limit is one of the main reasons for accidental deaths and injuries on our roads. Speeding is also a concern that is often raised by residents and councillors and establishing a local Speedwatch is seen as one way to improve the safety on our roads for pedestrians, dog-walkers, cyclists and all road users.

Assistance has already been offered by our local Police and the next step is to form a team of volunteers.

Here's how you can help:

We need a small team of volunteers (approx. 12) to help make our roads safer. If you think you can help, or have any questions, please email townclerk@saxmundham-tc.gov.uk

Please note, this is not a massive commitment! After some initial training by the Police on what to do and how the equipment works, it is anticipated 2 or 3 Speedwatch sessions a year, subject to the availability of equipment. Each session is about an hour long and involves a team of 3 volunteers: so we think roughly 15 hours or so for each volunteer over a year. That is a small commitment but could help make a big difference to safety on our roads.

SHOULD THE TOWN **COUNCIL SEEK TO TAKE ON MORE PUBLIC LAND?**

Saxmundham Town Council is the owner of some public land in the town - e.g. the Memorial Field, some playgrounds (not all) and the Market Hall - but more public land is owned by East Suffolk Council. This includes Fromus Square (between Waitrose and High Street), the Market Place car park and WCs, as well as other green spaces. These include the green between the Hopkins estate and the river ('Fromus Green'), and the area along the brook in Brook Farm estate.

The District Council has asked us if the Town Council is interested in taking on any of their land assets in the parish (though they do not promise to do so). The Town Council has identified Fromus Square is its number one priority to take on, since it offers many opportunities for activities such as market stalls and entertainments.

We also have a potential interest in taking ownership of the car park, as this would allow parking policies and pricing to be adapted to the town's needs. However, maintenance of car parks and WCs does not come without significant net cost, which would fall to the Town Council (i.e. our 'share' of council tax). Of the green spaces, 'Fromus Green' is near the centre of town and could give local people more say over how it is maintained and used - but the cost of maintenance would fall locally as well.

At this stage, we would like to ask whether you agree or disagree in principle with the Town Council seeking ownership of any of these assets, and if so, which one(s). We would, of course, need to ensure that the cost of doing so was reasonable before doing so.

NEXT STEPS FOR THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN (NP)

We published and consulted on the first draft of the Saxmundham Neighbourhood Plan (NP) late last year. Over 150 people came to our dropin sessions at the Market Hall, and in the end nearly 100 written comments - some brief, some lengthy - were received. Many thanks to all! Most responses were broadly supportive; many helpful comments and criticisms were received on specific issues.

The NP Steering Group has looked in detail at each of your comments, and as a result, a number of changes will be made.

The next steps (it's a long and complex process!) are:

• The Steering Group sends its 2nd

draft, with the changes, to East Suffolk Council (local planning authority), which does its own 6 week consultation

- East Suffolk then passes the draft NP to an Independent Examiner, who may also propose drafting changes
- The final version is published by East Suffolk Council, which organizes a local referendum in Saxmundham
- If more than half of those voting in the Referendum say Yes, the Plan is adopted.

Please note, a NP cannot by law contradict National or Local Plan

policies. The 800 dwelling Garden Neighbourhood is a policy of East Suffolk's Local Plan. We have tried to ensure that this new development will work as well for the town as we can, but the NP cannot change that policy.

There are two big pluses to having a NP in force:

(a) it provides more local say, through its policies, when planning applications for development in Saxmundham come forward,

(b) the town gets more funding via Community Infrastructure Levy paid by developers; the percentage received by the town for new developments goes up from 15% (now) to 25% .

IP17GNS UPDATE

Saxmundham's community-based volunteer service, IP17GNS, is busier than ever. We're setting our sights on building a resilient and inclusive community that cares for each other. Now, 2 years after we began, we intend:

- People in our community are confident in asking for help when they need it and providing help to others when they can.
- People in our community feel less lonely, more connected and have opportunities for social interaction.
- People in our community are more confident and motivated to make changes to their lives to improve their health, well-being and life chances
- · People are proud to live in our community.

Our trustees and management committee are dedicated to these aims and providing services and activities which achieve them.

The idea behind a Good Neighbour Scheme is different from a lot of charities in that while we do offer financial and practical help to people, we also place a big emphasis on finding solutions and skills within our existing community that will enhance the lives of others.




Our volunteers and funders live in the community they serve and there is a real sense of coming together to make our local area a better place to live.

Since the beginning of the year, we have completed 382 jobs which are in line with our values. These include 134 prescription deliveries to people isolating or unable to leave their homes, supplied 144 people with emergency food provision (including distributing £5k of Tesco vouchers kindly supplied by Suffolk Community Foundation). 'There is an acute and ongoing need for services to support struggling families in IP17,' explains Bryony Peall, IP17GNS's Operations Manager. 'People are being squeezed with higher bills alongside cuts in support such as Universal Credit.'

We have also made 41 personal-shopper trips for people who can't get to the shops themselves and our Line Dancing, Gather & Grow and Funky Fridays groups have attracted 160 participants and encouraged social interaction and physical activity.

This month we will be celebrating our 2nd anniversary, as a charity. The activities our volunteers carry out now is often guite different to those early days of Covid. But the impact it has within our community is no less important or impressive. In recent years we have navigated
