
SAXMUNDHAM WW1 MEMORIAL TRAIL

Private 473141, Clifford John Welham, Military Medal, 88th Field Ambulance, Royal Army Medical Corps, 1897 – 23 November 1917

High Street - Ironmongers, stop 3.

Private, 205876 Frank William Flatman, 1st Battalion, Bedfordshire Regiment, (formerly 265397 Suffolk Regiment), 1888 - 23 August 1918.

Fromus Square, The War Memorial, stop 4.

In July 2005, the new Memorial was inaugurated some sixty years after the end of the Second World War and nearly eightyseven years since the end of hostilities of the First World War.



Between Fromus Square and Fromus Green, stop 5.

Who was A.E. Kerridge? A likely candidate is Albert Ernest Kerridge, born 1881 and resident in the Plomesgate Union House in 1891.

Fromus Walk, stop 6.

Sergeant 200284 (formerly 1798) William Frederick Camp-Jermyn, 4th Battalion, Suffolk Regiment, September 1897- 27 June 1917. Camp-Jermyn is commemorated on Saxmundham Memorials, albeit no record exists that records him or his family living in the town.

United Reformed Church, (formerly

Acting Sergeant 23810, <u>Charles George Cooper</u>, 2nd Battalion, Suffolk Regiment, 1896 – 26 September 1917 and Lieutenant-Colonel <u>Charles Frederick Pretor-Pinney</u>, DS), 13th Battalion, Rifle Brigade, 9 June 1864 – 28 April 1917 and Second Lieutenant <u>Harry Akers Row</u>, 4th Battalion, Suffolk Regiment, 22 March 1886 – 11 March 1915 and his brother Second Lieutenant John Eric Row, 8th Battalion, Suffolk Regiment, 22 January 1891 – 29 October 1916
